

Guidelines for uploading knowledge products on the MobiliseYourCity Knowledge Platform

I General guidelines

I.I Open Information Principle

The MobiliseYourCity Knowledge Platform is an open system that only requires a login to access its functionalities. When you have created an account, then you will be able to download and upload knowledge products on the Platform.

I.2 Scope and audience of the platform

The MobiliseYourCity Knowledge Platform is the knowledge and exchange infrastructure for the MobiliseYourCity Global Community of Practice. Therefore, any knowledge product uploaded on the platform can be seen by all kind of members of this Community, primarily: Member Cities and Countries, MobiliseYourCity In-Country Management Teams, Consultant Teams, Implementing Partners, Funding Partners, Knowledge and Network Partners. As it is an open system, any practitioners and interested persons are also able to view the information uploaded on the platform.

1.3 Quality requirements and general relevance of contents for upload

These Guidelines set the quality requirements related to the contents shared on the MobiliseYourCity Platform by the users.

- **Inappropriate content** includes sexual, sexist, racist, discriminative, violent or aggressive speeches, and commercial contents. Moderation activities specifically target those categories.
- **Appropriate content** excludes inappropriate ones; it generally relates to the <u>theme</u> of sustainable urban mobility and the <u>activities</u> around it worldwide and from all scales:
 - Advocacy;
 - Policy development & planning processes;
 - Documenting the implementation of MobiliseYourCity capacity building and technical assistance service lines to Member Cities and Countries;
 - Reporting updates: innovations, lessons learnt, cases, trends, impacting events, major steps taken by global or local actors towards sustainable urban mobility.

Note to Implementing partners from MobiliseYourCity: Only some of the information generated through SUMP and NUMP activities are seen as "knowledge product" and considered relevant for upload. This covers the following outputs:





- MobiliseDays deliverables;
- All final deliverables and key support documents related to the on-going or past implementation of SUMP or NUMP <u>Components</u> (including MRV-GHG activities), being done in the framework of a technical assistance or not;
- All final deliverables and key support documents related to the on-going or past implementation of MRV-GHG <u>activities</u> (i.e. "Transversal Mission" in ToR document), including trainings, being done in the framework of a technical assistance or not;

I.4 Sources

Typical sources are proposed in the category "institutions". Please make sure your knowledge product relates to one of the proposed category, If not, make sure the source of your knowledge product is trustworthy and clearly indicated in the document.

If you are a MobiliseYourCity Partner, please make sure the knowledge product you want to upload is produced by the adequate sources as mentioned in the category "Type of Content" / MYC Content hereafter.

2 How to adequately label your knowledge product?

2.1 Title of your contribution (required field)

Whatever the language of the knowledge product you are posting, we ask you to add the title in the three languages of the platform (using an online translator if necessary).

2.2 Topic (required field)

Please select the right topic(s) to ensure your document is correctly referenced.

To clarify, "SUMP" is the acronym for Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan and "NUMP" is the acronym for National Urban Mobility Policy.

If your product relates to one of the proposed sub-categories, then please tick the box. If not, tick no box.

2.3 Language (required field)

Please tick the box corresponding to the original language of the knowledge product you are providing.





2.4 Knowledge Product type (required field)

Here is some detail about the proposed categories to help you chose the right one:

2.5 MobiliseYourCity Product (required field)

Is the knowledge product you are uploading a Community Content or a MobiliseYourCity content?

- **Definition of Community Content**: This content is the "general" category" for all information related to sustainable urban mobility that is of interest for the audience of this knowledge platform, and respecting the guidelines stated in section 1 of this document.
- Definition of <u>MYC Content</u>: This content refers to knowledge products developed by the MobiliseYourCity Partnership. Output from the following actors should be tagged as MYC content:
 - Implementing Partner Teams of MobiliseYourCity (for the current list, please see: <u>https://mobiliseyourcity.net/about_the_partnership</u>)
 - Partner Country-based National Program Management team;
 - Partner City-based Project Management team;
 - Project-related Consultant teams;
 - Secretariat of MobiliseYourCity in Brussels.

2.6 Scope

Pleas tick the box corresponding to the scope of the knowledge product you are providing. If there is no corresponding box, then don't tick any box.

2.7 Institution

Please tick the box(es) corresponding to the source(s) of the knowledge product you are providing. If there is no corresponding box, then don't tick any box.

2.8 Geography

Please enter the region, country or continent your knowledge product is about. You can add several by separating each entry with a comma. Referencing your knowledge product appropriately will allow it to appear on other related pages of the Knowledge Platform and increase its visibility.





2.9 Short description (required field)

Please enter a short description of the Knowledge Product you are posting.

2.10 Full article

If relevant, you can enter here the full article or a longer description including links when relevant.

2.11 Document

Please upload your Knowledge Product here. You can add a maximum of 20 files with a limit of 20 MB. Allowed formats are: txt jpeg jpg doc docx pdf.

2.12 Images

Please provide a relevant and high-quality image to illustrate your Knowledge Product. You can add a maximum of 20 files with a limit of 20 MB. Allowed formats are: png gif jpg jpeg.
